Finding Books

Library Catalog

Includes information about books, government documents, journals, magazines, and newspapers in the Library.

Note: To locate appropriate Library of Congress Subject Headings, start with a keyword search and then browse records.

Relevant subject headings include:

- Anthropology
- Economic anthropology
- Food social aspects
- Human beings effect of environment on
- Human ecology
- Human ecology economic aspects
- Nature effect of human beings on
- Social ecology

Search Syntax

Truncation: use a dollar sign \$.

Phrase Searching: use double quotation marks “ ”.

Wildcard: use a question mark ?.

WorldCat

Indexes books, periodicals, and other materials held by libraries around the world. Search *WorldCat* to identify additional books on your topic and then order the books on [interlibrary loan](#).

Note: It can be helpful to identify relevant Library of Congress Subject Headings in the Library Catalog first; you can then do a subject search in *WorldCat* to find additional items with these subject headings.

Search Syntax:

Truncation: use an asterisk *.

Phrase Searching: insert a “w” between the words in a phrase (for example, “cold w war”).

Wildcard: use a question mark ?.

ebrary

Contains over 38,000 e-books published by over 220 academic, trade, and professional publishers; covers all subject areas. Also includes tools that allow you to create your own virtual bookshelf, bookmark pages, and add and save notes and highlights.

Search Syntax

Phrase Searching: use double quotation marks “ ”.

Economy

[EconLit](#)

(1969 to present) Provides bibliographic citations and selected abstracts to journal articles from 326 journals; also indexes doctoral dissertations, books, and conference proceedings. Areas covered include economic theory and history, monetary theory and financial institutions, labor economics, and international, regional, and urban economics.

Search Syntax

- Truncation: use an asterisk *.

Environment

[BioOne Abstracts and Indexes](#)

(1998 to present) Indexes the BioOne collection, a set of over 50 peer-reviewed journals in the biological, ecological, and environmental sciences. Includes keyword-searchable abstracts and links to full-text articles.

Search Syntax

- Truncation: use an asterisk *.
- Phrase Searching: automatic.
- Wildcard: use a question mark ?.

[LexisNexis Environmental](#)

(1975 to present) Includes *Environment Abstracts*, which indexes over 650 environmental sciences journals. *LexisNexis Environmental* also contains full-text articles from newspapers, trade journals, consumer magazines, newsletters, and more than 40 law reviews as well as codes and regulations from federal and state agencies.

Culture

[Annual Review of Anthropology](#)

(1972 to present) Contains the full text of review and overview articles on important topics in anthropology.

Search Syntax

- Truncation: use an asterisk *.
- Phrase Searching: use double quotation marks “ ”.
- Wildcard: use a question mark ?.

[Anthropology Plus](#)

(Late 19th century to the present) Includes citations to journal articles, reports, edited works, and commentaries in the fields of biological, cultural, linguistic, physical, and social anthropology as well as archaeology, ethnology, folklore, and material culture. Combines *Anthropological Literature* and *Anthropological Index* from the Royal Anthropological Institute in London.

Search Syntax

- Truncation: use an asterisk *.
- Phrase Searching: insert a “w” between the words in a phrase (for example, “cold w war”).
- Wildcard: use a question mark ?.

[AnthroSource](#)

(1880 to present) Provides current issues of 15 American Anthropological Association (AAA) journals, including *American Anthropologist*, *American Ethnologist*, and *Cultural Anthropology*, as well as an archive of selected back issues, with links to JSTOR where appropriate.

Search Syntax

- Truncation: automatic.
- Phrase Searching: use double quotation marks “ ”.

[Sociological Abstracts](#)

(1963 to present) Provides indexing and abstracting for articles in 1,500 journals and serial publications in the field of sociology and related disciplines in the social and behavioral sciences. Also provides coverage of reviews, monographs, and conference reports in these areas.

Search Syntax

- Truncation: use an asterisk *.
- Phrase Searching: automatic.
- Wildcard: use a question mark ?.

Interdisciplinary

[Annual Reviews](#)

(1932 to present) Contains the full text of review and overview articles on important topics in the Biomedical, Life, Physical, and Social Sciences.

Search Syntax

- Truncation: use an asterisk *.
- Phrase Searching: use double quotation marks “ ”.
- Wildcard: use a question mark ?.

[ASSIA: Applied Social Sciences Index and Abstracts](#)

(1987 to present) Indexes articles on topics related to health, economics, education, psychology, race relations, social services, and sociology. International in scope.

Search Syntax

- Truncation: use an asterisk *.
- Phrase Searching: automatic.
- Wildcard: use a question mark ?.

[Essay and General Literature Index](#)

(1900 to present) Indexes essays published in books and edited collections. Covers the fields of art, economics, education, history, law, linguistics, literature, music, philosophy, political science, and religion, among others. Particularly strong in the humanities and social sciences.

Search Syntax

- Truncation: unnecessary when using “All – Smart Search”; otherwise, use an asterisk *.
- Phrase Searching: use double quotation marks “ ”.
- Wildcard: do not use with “All – Smart Search”; otherwise, use a question mark ?.

[ISTOR](#)

A searchable archive of the back issues of major scholarly journals.

Search Syntax

- Truncation: use a plus sign +.
- Phrase Searching: automatic.

[Project Muse](#)

(c. mid-1990s to present) A searchable collection of full-text articles from journals published by university and scholarly presses.

Search Syntax

- Truncation: use an asterisk *.
- Phrase Searching: use double quotation marks “ ”.

[Social Sciences Abstracts](#)

(1907 to present) Indexes articles in over 500 English-language periodicals in the fields of anthropology, communication, corrections, economics, environmental studies, ethics, gender studies, geography, international relations, law, political science, psychology, sociology, and related subjects. Includes the full text of selected articles from 1995 to the present.

Search Syntax

- Truncation: unnecessary when using “All – Smart Search”; otherwise, use an asterisk *.
- Phrase Searching: use double quotation marks “ ”.
- Wildcard: do not use with “All – Smart Search”; otherwise, use a question mark ?.

[Web of Knowledge](#)

(c. 1900 to present) A multidisciplinary resource that provides citations to articles in over 10,000 journals in the social sciences, humanities, and sciences.

Search Syntax

- Truncation: use an asterisk *.
- Phrase Searching: use double quotation marks “ ”.
- Wildcard: use a question mark ?.

Finding the Full-Text Copy of an Article

If you’ve found a citation in an online index or database:

Many of our indexes and databases contain full-text copies of the articles they index. Look first for a link to the full-text (either in HTML or PDF).

If the database does not contain a link to the full-text, look for the gray **Search for Article** button in the online citation. This button will lead you to the Davidson Library Catalog, which will display the holdings for the journal. Using your citation information, check to see if the library owns the appropriate journal and volume number. If it does not, you can request it from [Interlibrary Loan](#).

If you found the citation somewhere else:

Go to the [Davidson Library Catalog](#). Look for the red periodicals button on the right side of the page. Click on that button and enter the first few words of the journal title in the search box. Then, do a **Title beginning with** search. The library’s holdings for the journal will appear on the page. Using your citation information, check to see if the library owns (in print or electronic form) the volume you need. If the library does not own it, you can request the article from [Interlibrary Loan](#).
