

How to Find Books-on-Tape & Books-on-CD in the E.H. Little Library

All of the Library's books-on-tape and books-on-CD are listed in the Library Catalogue.

To see a list of all the books-on-tape and books-on-CD,

Step 1: Go into the Library Catalogue.

Step 2: In the first drop-down menu, change the default from "All Davidson Library Collections" to "Little Library without Government Information."

Step 3: Enter the phrase "sound recording" in the search box.

Step 4: Under "Keyword Search Limits," in the second drop-down menu that says "Limit by format," choose "Sound recordings."

Step 5: Click on the "Search" button to run your search.

General Keyword Tips

- Enclose phrases in double quotation marks.
e.g. "global warming"
- Use Boolean operators (AND, OR, NOT) to combine terms.
e.g. human\$ and (cats or dogs)
e.g. economy and (mexico not new)
- For words with hyphens, try searching both with and without the hyphen.
e.g. "eighteenth-century studies" or "eighteenth century studies"
- Search for singular, plural, and all variant endings of a word by using the truncation symbol \$.
e.g. librar\$ retrieves library, libraries, librarian, etc.
- Use the wildcard ? to replace any one character within a word.
e.g. wom?n retrieves both woman and women
