Psychology Major Requirements: Text

- Psychology majors are required to take 10 courses including PSY 101, 200 and 300, one 300-level PSY seminar, and a capstone course (400, 401, or 402). Two courses must be hands-on lab/methods courses from: PSY 301, 302, 303, 304, 305, 313, 314, 315, 317, 318, 319, 320 or BIO 223.
 - Of the 10 courses, students must take at least one in each of the following areas.
 - Cognitive/Neuroscience courses: PSY 276, 280, 282, 284, 295*, 296*, 301, 302, 303, 304, 305, 324, Bio 220 or 223
 - **Developmental/Clinical courses:** PSY 220, 231, 234, 241, 242, 243, 245, 280, 297*, 314, 315, 319
 - Social/Industrial-Organizational courses: PSY 232, 235, 254, 260, 266, 269, 298*, 313, 317, 318, 320, POL 384
 - Courses marked with an asterisk are reserved for transfer credits. PSY 280 may count in either the Cognitive/Neuroscience area or Developmental/Clinical area, but not both.
- The seminar requirement may not satisfy any area requirement. In addition, all seniors must satisfactorily complete an oral interview conducted by a psychologist who is not a member of the department.
