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Center for Diversity and Inclusion Mission

The Center for Diversity and Inclusion (CDI) fosters an inclusive and welcoming environment on campus for systemically underrepresented student populations at Davidson College. The Center pursues this goal by providing direct support services, educational programming and community building opportunities within and across social groups. The Center supports students of color, undocumented/DACA, LGBTQIA+ and first-generation student populations.

Staff

The Center for Diversity and Inclusion is led by the Assistant Dean of Students for Diversity and Inclusion, and supported by the Program Coordinator for Diversity and Inclusion. In addition to them, there are three teams of student staff: the LGBTQIA+ team, the Education and Advocacy team, and the STRIDE team.



Lavender Lounge

The Lavender Lounge is a space for LGBTQIA+ and questioning students. It is located in the sub-basement of Belk Residence Hall, and is open 24 hours weekdays and weekends with Catcard access. LGBTQIA+ student staff have approximately 2-5 office hours in the lounge throughout the week. There are LGBTQIA+ books and DVDs available for students to rent out.

Events

The LGBTQIA+ team of student staff plans a range of events throughout the year that are for different communities within the larger LGBTQIA+ community. Events we've hosted in the past include: a Queer People of Color dinner series, a "Family Friday" movie night series, and various events during National Coming Out Week such as the Trans* Dinner, an installation of student stories and art, and an exhibit of the history of Coming Out at Davidson, a QPOC Karaoke event, and a LGBTQIA+ movie night. We also collaborate with student organizations, such as our co-sponsored Queersgiving with Queers & Allies.

Residence Life Office

The Residence Life Office makes it a priority for every student to feel welcome and included in their living environment.

Community programming by student staff members will emphasize the Residence Life Office's departmental learning goal of Inclusive Excellence. Some topics will include education on and the exploration of gender identity, the intersection of social identities, and the LGBTQIA+ community.

Gender Inclusive Housing Information: Some students feel more comfortable in a living environment where men and women live interspersed and not separated on wings, hallways or rooms defined by gender. Davidson College offers a wide range of residential options for students, many of which are either gender integrated or gender inclusive. For first-year students, students can preference a mixed gender floor or a single gender floor.

Upper-class students can live in buildings with gender interspersed rooms and suite and eventually, live in a suite or apartment with other students regardless of gender identity.

Gender Inclusive Housing offers a gender-integrated community with a variety of living options to meet those needs. In Gender Inclusive Housing, rooms are not designated by gender during the room selection process for greater assignment flexibility.

Community bathrooms in Gender Inclusive Housing do not have a gender designation. We work with all students who identify as transgender or genderqueer on an individual basis to determine which housing options are best for them.

Queers & Allies (Q&A)

Queers and Allies is the largest and oldest student organization at Davidson College with the fundamental aim of building community for and awareness of the LGBTQIA+ community on campus. Through various monthly and annual events, Q&A advocates for increasing awareness and celebrating the diversity of the LGBTQIA+ population at Davidson College in all aspects of campus life.

You Are Not A Stranger Here (YANASH)

YANASH is a confidential student group created by students for any and every Davidson College student to seek queer community without the pressures and fears of coming out. The organization fosters an inclusive environment for attendees to seek information about queer identities, gender identities, and sexualities in group and peer support networks.

Queer Mentorship Program

The Queer Mentorship Program pairs incoming first year students with queer sophomore, junior, or senior Davidson College students. The program recognizes that the transition to college is a hard time, especially so for queer and/or questioning first year students. The organization hopes that a mentor can help assist and guide students through their acclimation to Davidson College and create a more welcoming community at Davidson College.

Religious Life

The Chaplains' Office, located on the 4th floor of the Alvarez College Union, has a long history of supporting the LGBTQIA+ community, going back to the formation of the first queer students' group at Davidson in the 1980s. Chaplain Rob Spach is a minister in the Presbyterian Church USA, which is fully inclusive of the LGBTQIA+ community. He recently officiated at the wedding of a gay Davidson couple. Associate Chaplain Grace Burford is Buddhist and identifies as lesbian. The office staff speak often with and have resources for students exploring their sexuality, gender identity, and religious faith or spirituality. You don't need to be religious, though, to find a welcoming embrace and support from the Chaplains' Office.

Student Counseling Center

The Davidson College Center for Student Health and Well-Being strives to create an inclusive and supportive environment where students who are Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex, etc. (LGBTQIA+) all students regardless of sexual orientation, gender identity/expression, and sex are welcomed, supported, valued, and engaged. The Davidson College Center for Student Health and Well-Being which is made up of therapists, nurses, health educators, dietitians, and administrative staff share a common approach of affirming that all persons have the potential to live fully functioning and emotionally healthy lives throughout the lifespan along the full spectrum of gender identity and gender expression.

The Center for Student Health and Well-Being is proud to stand with the LGBTQIA+ community and provide a safe and welcoming place to get health care and information. Counselor and Coordinator for Diversity, Equity and Inclusion started in the Fall of 2019 and a LGBTQIA+ focused counselor will begin in Fall 2020.

Bias Incident Response and Education

Davidson College is an institution of higher learning and is committed to providing a safe and inclusive environment for all members of the community. Students, faculty, and staff all play a vital role in creating living and learning spaces that are free from bias, harassment, intimidation and hate.

What is a Bias Incident?

A bias incident is also an offense against a person or property motivated in whole or in part by the offender's bias against a race, religion, disability, ethnic origin, sexual orientation or gender identity BUT may not rise to the level of a crime.

Gender and Sexuality Studies

This interdisciplinary major and minor trains students to examine gender relations and the construction of gender and sexual difference from a globally-informed perspective and to consider how gender and sexuality intersect with the social categories of race, class, ethnicity, disability, and age to produce our complex social identities. The department offers a range of courses on queer and trans* studies such as Queer Families, Latinx Sexual Dissidence, Television: Queer Representations, Queer Ethnographies, and Transgender Studies.

The Charles N. Williamson Endowment, created by Dr. Charles Nelson Williamson '64, promotes the learning and understanding of LGBTQIA+ issues through curricular and co-curricular projects and programs. The Williamson Endowment is administered through the Office of the Vice President for Academic Affairs and has supported a variety of programming, speakers, conferences, and workshops related to queer and trans* studies. It also supports the Williamson Teaching Award, which enriches the college's curricular offerings in queer studies. The Williamson awardee is a tenured core GSS faculty member who, over the two years of the award appointment, teaches core courses in GSS and creates one new course in queer/sexuality studies.
